Discussion Participation

The student discussion forums are an important part of an online class. The discussions help to build a community of learners and enhance your understanding of the topics. This is part of your a professional training: you should show respect for classmates and differences of opinion, and participate in a professional manner. As this is a student discussion, I will not respond to every post. Only the initial post is graded. I suggest that you type your response in a word processor, and correct any spelling or grammar errors before copying to the forum.

The guidelines below will help you to get the most out of the discussions:

- Submit your initial post early in the week and respond to other learners at timely intervals. The goal is to have a dynamic discussion around the topic that lasts throughout the week.
- Posts and responses should be thorough and thoughtful. Just posting an "I agree" or "Good ideas" will not be considered adequate. Support statements with examples, experiences, or references.
- Posts should be long enough to answer the question, usually about 3-5 sentences.
- When relevant, add to the discussion by including prior knowledge, work experiences, references, web sites, resources, etc. (giving credit when appropriate).
- Contributions to the discussions (posts and responses) should be complete and free of grammatical or structural errors.
